The following Saturday, March 27, will be set aside to go back down those same streets leaving a gospel presentation and some information about Heritage inviting them to come for services the week and weekend of Easter.

You can sign-up by going to the church website, by calling the church office or by visiting the Across Alabama information table outside the Worship Center. You do not have to say anything these 2 Saturdays, just be on a team to prayer walk and hang bags on doors - its just that SIMPLE! Sign up today and have a front row seat as we see what God is going to do through this Across Alabama experience!

During the last weekend of January, several of our students got to taste hunger, learn about poverty in Montgomery and beyond, raise money for World Vision and experience God through Bible study and worship. The event was the 30 Hour Famine, which is a national youth movement sponsored by World Vision, a Christian humanitarian organization. Our students fasted from food for 30 hours and God was able to move in their hearts through intimate worship, informative games, service projects and a prayer walk in downtown Montgomery.
